Parent Questionnaire

Scooters and Bikes

The use of scooters and bikes to get to school is encouraged and it is great to see children using this to get to and from school.

Just a quick reminder please:

- Children should dismount from bikes and scooters while on the school premises
- Electric scooters are not permitted on school grounds (see information below)

Owning your own e-scooter (Information from the police)

It's not currently possible to get insurance for privately owned escooters. This means it's illegal to use them on the road or in public spaces, such as parks, street pavements, and shopping centres.

If you use a privately-owned e-scooter in public, you risk the vehicle being seized under S.165 Road Traffic Act 1988 for having no insurance.

If you cause serious harm to another person whilst riding an e-scooter, the incident will be investigated in the same way it would if you were riding a motorcycle or driving a car.

Where you can use your own e-scooter

If you own an e-scooter, you can only use it in on private land, such as in a garden. But you must have the permission of the landowner to do so.




Half Term Challenge – Catch a falling leaf

Why not go on an autumn walk to a park and catch the leaf there?



Is your child in Year 6?

The deadline to apply for a secondary school place is

31 October 2024.

Parents should always include at least one of the very local secondary schools.

If you are out of catchment for all of your choices - you are unlikely to get one of them; if this happens the local authority will offer your child a place at the next nearest school with a place — this could be miles and miles away and does not have to be one on your list!

Reception admissions for Sept 2025

Applications are now open for Reception class entry for September 2025. The closing date is 15th January 2025.

If you would like your child to get a place in our reception, you need to make an application directly to the local authority where you live – for most people this will be Birmingham.

Apply via the local authority website

https://www.birmingham.gov.uk/schooladmissions

You must apply on time. If you apply late, you are less likely to get offered a place at any of your preferred schools. Applications received after the closing date will be classed as late applications and will not be processed until after the offer of places which usually take place in mid April

- attendance at a nursery class does not give a child automatic priority
 for a place you MUST still apply via the Local Authority
- do not wait until your child is 5 years old, or your preferred school may already be full

You can list up to 3 preferred schools when you apply.


Please note:

- Parents should not need to call the office or message staff to ask if we are open or closed – they should check messages first.
- We DO NOT typically message parents to say school is open, UNLESS there is significant snow and we wish to be clear regarding school being open.



All children in Year 6 requiring a place at secondary school must make an application.
