<u>Year 5 – Design Technology – Mezze plates</u>

In design and technology lessons, each class study three units across the year – Cook; Sew; Make.

All of these follow a design process with a product at the end.

Here you can see a few photos of the Year 5 outcomes of their Cook unit



where the children made Greek Mezze (pronounced "meh-zay") plates

Mezze, a style of dining in the Mediterranean and the Middle East and is meant to make up the entire meal. This style of eating features a combination of cold and hot foods, including vegetables, meat, dips, and breads.



Children learned different cutting techniques such as the claw and bridge, along with different cuts.


Reception – Poppy art

Flu Vaccines

Forms for the nasal flu vaccine to be administered in school were sent home yesterday and today.

Please return these on Monday 11th November.

The Birmingham Community Healthcare NHS Foundation Trust say:

This programme helps protect children against flu, which can be very unpleasant and lead to complications like bronchitis and pneumonia. The flu vaccine not only helps to prevent the transmission of flu to the wider community, including older family members and new-born babies who may have a weaker immune system, but research by Public Health England has shown that the flu vaccine programme has reduced the number of people visiting their GP or emergency departments with flu. Research has also showed that vaccinating school aged children reduces pupil and staff absences.



This non porcine gelatine vaccination is available at community clinics which will be running throughout the flu season.

Scooters and Bikes

The use of scooters and bikes to get to school is encouraged and it is great to see children using this to get to and from school.

Just a quick reminder please:

- Children should dismount from bikes and scooters while on the school premises
- Electric scooters are not permitted on school grounds (see information below)

Reception admissions for Sept 2025

Applications are now open for Reception class entry for September 2025. The closing date is 15th January 2025.

If you would like your child to get a place in our reception, you need to make an application directly to the local authority where you live – for most people this will be Birmingham.

Apply via the local authority website https://www.birmingham.gov.uk/schooladmissions

You must apply on time. If you apply late, you are less likely to get offered a place at any of your preferred schools. Applications received after the closing date will be classed as late applications and will not be processed until after the offer of places which usually take place in mid April

- attendance at a nursery class does not give a child automatic priority
 for a place you MUST still apply via the Local Authority
- do not wait until your child is 5 years old, or your preferred school may already be full

You can list up to 3 preferred schools when you apply.


Please note:

- We will always announce any unexpected school closure via Class Dojo AND direct in-app message via Arbor. If there is no message – there is no closure.
- Parents should not need to call the office or message staff to ask if we are open or closed – they should check messages first.
- We DO NOT typically message parents to say school is open, UNLESS there is significant snow and we wish to be clear regarding school being open.
